India and Canada jointly release Diwali stamps For the first time, India and Canada jointly launched stamps to mark Diwali, the festival of lights.

ndia and Canada have unveiled their first joint stamp, as the countries simultaneously issued stamps to celebrate the festival of Diwali.


The Canadian event to mark this collaborative release was held in Toronto on 21st September and was attended by Canada Post president and CEO Deepak Chopra, India's high commissioner Vikas Swarup, India's consul general in Toronto Dinesh Bhatia and Toronto mayor John Tory.

The Diwali stamp expresses pride in Canada being a land of diverse faiths, customs and celebrations. It is fitting that this historic first joint issue celebrates the strong relationship between Canada and India.

The official first day cover was cancelled in Toronto. The stamps were designed by Doreen Colonello of Entro Communications and India Post.

A similar event was held in New Delhi and was attended by Canada's envoy Nadir Patel and chief postmaster general (Delhi) LN Sharma.

Both versions of the stamp feature diyas, the traditional Diwali lamps, with fireworks in the background.

In addition to the coins and currency notes that were displayed, those were the knowledge sharing banners which were the major attraction. It was made easy to learn the coin anatomy and also about the mint marks through various banners and parents – students were seen checking their coins for the mint marks with broad smiles.

Exhibition's highlight apart of error coins was the currency note which consist the names of both nations India and Pakistan on it. There have been instances when the Indian Currencies imprinted with text like 'For use in Pakistan' have been issued. In the initial years, the Government of Pakistan used super inscribed Indian notes as its Paper Money until they were gradually replaced by Pakistani currency by 1949. The notes contained captions like "Government of Pakistan" in English and "Hukumat e Pakistan" in Urdu. Notes of Rs. 1, 2, 5, 10 and 100 were super inscribed in such a manner.

How did they manage to have such a huge collection? "It started as a hobby when I was in school. And over a period of time, I developed a passion for it," expresses Siddharth Shah, who deals in almost every collectible coin and currency note and is himself a coin enthusiastic for years. Few collectibles displayed were also from the part of collection of Shri. Rahul Keshwani, Mustafa Arsiwala and Tejas Shah, who are collecting coins and currency notes for years now. Mr. Siddharth Shah is also the founder president of ICCG.

"The exhibition has provided an opportunity for the residents of the city to understand the country's historical and cultural achievements depicted on the coins and currency notes," explained Smt. Kiran Thakur a parent of fifth class student.

ICCG was formed five years ago and this was their first school exhibition. The exhibition was also intended to offer some other services like numismatic workshop to those interested.

How attractive could be a water bottle to start with a collection?

I have grown up watching my father Shri. Nilesh Gala who himself is a collector and has a wide range of collectibles. So I thought of collecting something different. Water bottle label was indeed a different subject and it also attracted me good.

What type of challenges did you face while making your collection?

It was quite challenging as I had to contact people from various places and request them for water bottles. I also put up advertisements to contact people who travelled different parts of the world. Friends and relatives were surely a good support.

Does such collection demand a lot of time and attention?

Yes, it asks for a lot of time and attention. It needs to be checked for 100 ml to 20 liters labels of different sizes. And also to arrange them alphabetically. Finally, cutting, sticking and filing also needs a lot of attention. One needs to be very serious in regards of his hobby.

Have you ever displayed your collection?

No, not yet. Though I have shared my collection with my friends and relatives but have yet not displayed it at any exhibition. This would be my first interview display..... Smiles

Is there any particular water bottle label which is more close to you?

Well, all are very close to me as I have collected them with lots of efforts, but yes, there are a couple of them which I would like to mention. One water bottle is of Air India which is more than 12 years old with date mentioned on it. And the other is a water bottle of 'Hotel Baiyokesky, Thailand' as its bottle and its label are of the same shape as that of the hotel.

With all your collection, how much satisfaction do you feel within?

After a pause Master Soham continues, "Yes, it surely fills an amount of satisfaction within after collecting more than 1000 water bottle labels from different parts of the world, but at the same time it further adds a lot of enthusiasm to continue with it. Hobby is a never ending journey which though adds to lot of fun but at the same time teaches you to be more serious, fills you with smiles and through you it becomes an inspiration for others." **Soham is a young boy but his thoughts are already quite motivational....**



For ICCG News, he added, "Incidentally it's my second interview in ICCG News as I still remember that ICCG News published a small bite of my interview during my father Shri. Nilesh Gala's interview in 2015. History Comes Alive at Ernakulam Numismatic Exhibition

OCHI: There was some great news for coin collection enthusiasts and history buffs. Coins used in the Mughal, Chola, Chera, Nawab and British era in India were exhibited at Ernakulam Town Hall, as part of the three-day 'Coin Expo' organized by Kerala Numismatic Society.

Coins used in the Roman dynasty and old dynasties in China, Taiwan, Korea, Africa and other parts of the world were also part of the exhibition. The copper, lead, silver, gold and nickel coins on display were hundreds of year old and attracted people from all walks of life, especially students.

Besides coins, old currencies, medals, treasure pots, stamps and postal cards were also on display. The expo also gave an opportunity for the public to buy these coins.



Oswal Antiques had put up coins belonging to Travancore and Cochin kingdoms for auction. A 'thulabharam' gold coin from Travancore kingdom was one of the main attractions at the auction.

The Bolboa currency of Panama, one of the rarest currencies in the world, was also on display. The currency was printed only once in 1941 and it was withdrawn within seven days.

Coins which were in use in the Gandhara kingdom in the sixth century BC, Byzantine Empire, Sangam Age and Satavahana dynasty were also part of the exhibition.

Also on display were the collections of R Madhusoodanan, a numismatist, who collects only those coins minted with images of elephants. He has a silver coin minted in Ivory Coast in 2010 and a fossil piece with a picture of a mammoth on it. "There is a small gold coin with the picture of an elephant on it from Kongu Desam which weighs only 8g. We need the support of a lens to see the elephant," he said.

Diwali puja consists of a combined puja of five deities: Ganesha is worshipped at the beginning of every auspicious act as Vighnaharta; Goddess Lakshmi is worshipped in her three forms Mahalakshmi, the goddess of wealth and money, Mahasaraswati, the goddess of books and learning and Mahakali. People also worship 'Kuber'- the treasurer of the gods.



The festival is also known as 'Laxhmipujan', which translates to 'the worship of Goddess Laxhmi'. Silver coins are worshipped on this occasion.

Non-Monetary Uses of Money – An Addendum:

There are several other traditions where money has played a very important part within the religion. In conclusion non-monetary uses of money are far reaching and can provide a sense of community and foster relationships between different families and individuals and numismatics has been playing a major part here for long.

The Perth Mint Australia Commemorates Diwali

Recently, the Perth mint released 1oz Silver coins to commemorate the festival of lights.

Reverse: The reverse of the coin features a colored representation of Lakshmi the Hindu goddess of wealth, health, fortune and prosperity, sitting on a lotus flower with gold coins pouring out of her hands, symbolizing material and spiritual wealth. The design includes the inscription 'happy diwali' and The Perth Mint's traditional 'P' mintmark.

Obverse: Issued as legal tender under the authority of the Government of Tuvalu, the coin's obverse depicts the Ian Rank-Broadley effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the monetary denomination and the 2017 year-date.

Limited Mintage: The Perth Mint will release no more than 5,000 of the Diwali Festival 2017 1oz Silver Coin.

Presentation Packaging with Numbered Certificate: The coin is housed in a contemporary, latex case which displays both sides of the coin. The case is packaged within a beautifully illustrated shipper, and is accompanied by a numbered Certificate of Authenticity.

ecently, Smt. Sulochanadevi Singhania School invited ICCG to conduct a Numismatic Workshop for class 5 students where students were explained how to brush up their geography and keep a date with historical events that had taken in the place they hail from. All of us love to hear their sweet jingling in our pockets and purses. Yet, few people know that coins have a unique connection with history. Numismatics is the science pertaining to the systematic collection, preservation and study of coins, is what the students got to learn during the 1 hour workshop.

In today's society, it appears as if several kids are preoccupied with films, music, internet, video games, etc and most parents are hunting for exciting, protected, and educational activities or hobbies that their kids

Rare Coins, Stamps Showcased in Manipal

arnataka: The two-day Tulunadpex – 2017, the philately and numismatics exhibition of Manipal University, began on 19th August at the Dr TMA Pai Hall. The exhibition, with a display of rare collections of stamps and coins has attracted a large number of people. A special cover was also released to commemorate the 60th anniversary of Manipal Institute of Technology. Six special covers in all were released.

The exhibition showcased some rare stamps and coins which made the show comparable with the best of exhibitions held elsewhere in the country. Among the eyecatching exhibits were post cards and stamps depicting the



life of Jesus Christ. The philatelic exhibition had a whole lot of themes of stamps and post cards of ancient times. There were stamps of unique shapes including hexagon, triangle and polygon, and different sizes too.

The coin collection was an introduction to the monetary world of ancient times from the Satavana Dynasty, Mughal Empire to British India. Also seen were coins of princely states of India like Mysore and Hyderabad. All special issues of coins made in India were also on display. Coins from countries like Russia, Croatia, Cape Verde and Bulgaria among others provided the audience a virtual feast. Students' collections of coins from schools across the region were also on display.

"The creation of the stamp is an art. This glorifies our culture and tells stories in the most minimalistic way possible," said S Rajendra Kumar, Post Master General.

Dr HS Ballal, Pro Chancellor, Manipal University, spoke of how important these stamp and coin collections were as they told tales of a bygone era. Such collections inspire students and prompt them to go back in time and explore their roots, which is necessary," Dr Ballal said.




and unanimously passed & approved the same. The AGM advised that the same be filed with the Registrar of Society.

PM Narendra Modi Releases Postage Stamp On Lord Ram

ARANASI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 22nd September released a postage stamp on different aspects of Lord Ram's life at the historic Tulsi Manas Mandir Varanasi, and said he was a source of inspiration for every individual. "There have been many stamps on Lord Ram, but this is the first of its kind stamp, which depicts different aspects of his life. This has not been done in the past. I am happy that I have got the opportunity to do this from the holy soil of Manas," he said.

The Tulsi Manas temple has great historical and cultural importance in Hinduism as it was here that Hindu epic Ramcharitmanas was said to have been originally written by poet-saint Goswami Tulsidas. "The life of Lord Ram is a source of inspiration for every individual. If we look at the life of Mahatma Gandhi, we see Lord Ram became a mantra for him since his childhood. Every aspect of the life of a great man (mahapurush) and chetnapurush (man who awakens consciousness) like him (Lord Ram) motivates us."

The Prime Minister said he could have released the stamp either at New Delhi's Vigyan Bhawan or his own residence, but then a thought came to

his mind that it is the auspicious period of Navaratra, and in the life of Lord Ram, Navratra and Vijayadashami hold special significance.

"A place where memories of Tulsidas are still alive.... There cannot be a better place than this Manas Mandir for releasing the postge stamp," he said.

He said postage stamps the world over contained history. A collection of such stamps would show what transformations a country went through, he said.

The prime minister later visited the Durga Mata Mandir.

Soon Coins to be Launched to Commemorate Birth Centenary of MGR

amil Nadu Chief Minister K Palaniswami today thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modifor the Centre's decision to release coins in Rs 100 and Rs five denominations in memory of AIADMK founder M G Ramachandran. "I express my whole hearted gratitude on behalf of the people of Tamil Nadu and on my personal behalf, for having issued orders to release commemorative coins in the memory of our great leader Puratchi Thalaivar (revolutionary leader) Dr M G Ramachandran," Palaniswami said in a letter to Modi.



The Union government on 12th September announced that it will issue the coins to

commemorate the birth centenary of 'Bharat Ratna' awardee and late chief minister M G Ramachandran, fondly called 'MGR' by his followers. Palaniswami said the state government had requested the Centre to release commemorative coins as a tribute to MGR, whose birth centenary is being celebrated this year.

Based on the request, he said, the central government had issued a gazette notification for the issue of the coins. The commemorative coins will bear the portrait of M G Ramachandran at the centre along with the inscription 'DR M G Ramachandran Birth Centenary' on the lower periphery.

ommemorative coins of India are usually issued to celebrate some special occasion or to mark a special event. They also have been issued as a mark of respect towards some distinguished individuals or monument. Indian commemorative coins were issued from the 1964 onwards. Such coins have a distinct design with reference to the occasion on which they were issued. Few coins of this category serve as collector's items only, although most commemorative coins are issued for regular circulation. Modern and Commemorative Indian Coins are very interesting to discuss as they cover various topics like Indian Independence Struggle, War, Peace, Wildlife, Vegetation, Great Personalities, Various Events and Organizations. The highest valued coin is INR 1000 that was issued on the occasion of 1000 years of Brihadeeswarar Temple. In 1 set, there may be 2 to 9 coins of different denominations.

MINTS: Commemorative coins are made at various mints across India including the ones at (Bombay) Mumbai, Noida, (Calcutta) Kolkata & Hyderabad.

1989 – FOOD AND ENVIRONMENT (9th WORLD FOOD DAY) ISSUE

In commemoration of the 9th World Food Day in 1989, India issued this 1 rupee commemorative coin on 16th October, 1989 with the theme "FOOD AND ENVIRONMENT".

Obverse: The obverse of this coin shows the Ashokan lion and the value '1' in International numerals on the center. In English

"INDIA" and "RUPEE" appear on the right periphery and in Hindi "Bharat" and "Rupaya" appear on the left. "Satyameva Jayate' in Hindi is shown just below the Ashokan Lion.

Reverse: The reverse of this coin shows three wheat stalks, with the sun and cloud in the background, the legend "FOOD AND ENVIRONMENT", "WORLD FOOD DAY" in English, "Khadya Ebam Paryabaran", "Biswa Khadya Divas" in Hindi, the F.A.O. crest and "1989" the year of issue.

Sir Jan Lingen Honored







