Commemorative cancellation calling for a Croatian and global fight against the COVID-19 corona virus pandemic with the text: "HRVATSKA I SVIJET PROTIV PANDEMIJE / KORONAVIRUSA COVID-19" (= Croatia and the world against the corona virus pandemic COVID-19).

The cancel appeared on several standard "Dan Hrvatske pošte" (= Day of the Croatia Post) postal cards, most likely with private imprints (at least 6 different ones), so they cannot be considered a proper full-featured philatelic material.

Special cover on 1,000 India Post ATMs

The Department of Posts has released a special cover to commemorate the milestone of 1,000 ATMs of India Post. The department stated that under the IT modernisation project, the Department of Posts commissioned its first ATM at Thyagarayanagar in Chennai on 25 February 2014, and the 1,000th ATM will be commissioned at Lunglei, Mizoram, on 17 June. During the lockdown period, (between 31 March and 31 May 2020) India Post ATMs supported 14,46,419 transactions for a total value of Rs 404.26 crores. The special cover will be released in Bengaluru by Sharda Sampath, chief postmaster general, Karnataka Circle, and simultaneously at Shillong by Amitabh Kharkwal, CPMG, North East Circle.




picture gallery are two buildings built in the architecture. They were

designed by two English architects, R.F. Chisholm – the then Consulting State Architect – and Major R.N. Ment. The general outline of the museum building is in conformity with the traditional local Maratha architecture of wooden framework filled with brick walls. But the ground floor has the pure European style, including a cornice decorated with a plaster copy of a Parthenon frieze. The south porch rising on a vast flight of steps is decorated with early and later Mughal forms. The pure gallery building is somewhat smaller and designed in a simple European brick style, but it has

Indian columns and open pavilions on the roof. The two building are connected by a covered bridge passage. The total floor area of both the buildings is about 40,000 sq. ft. The second-phase extension of the museum building is presently in progress.

Every year it has about 700,000 visitors from all parts of the world. For the benefit of visitors and the general public the museum periodically organizes cultural and educational exhibitions on various topics. Illustrated lectures are arranged in the museum's lecture theatre and experts on different subjects are specially invited for this purpose and educational films are shown regularly for the benefit of school children and visitors. Also the services of guides are provided. 'Gallery-talks' are also arranged for school children and illiterate students.

Facilities for drawing and study of exhibits at close quarters are provided. Necessary permission to take photographs of exhibits and to make use of the library for research work can be obtained by making a written application. The museum also publishes its research bulletins annually. Plaster-cast models of some selected objects of the museum are prepared by skilled artists in the modeling studio and sold to interested persons.

North Macedonia Stamp Withdrawn Because of Map Mistake

map shown on a new stamp from North Macedonia caused international controversy, and the Post of North Macedonia withdrew the stamp from sale May 9, a day after it was issued on 08th May 2020.

The post office also apologized for the mistake in a press release dated May 9 and posted on its website.

According to this press release, the 72-denar stamp was issued May 8 to commemorate Croatia's presidency of the Council of the European Union. The controversial part of the design is the map shown in red, white and blue behind Croatia's coat of arms.

According to a report on the English-language Total Croatia News website, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Serbia and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bosnia and Herzegovina made

In its apology, the post office expressed regret for the unintentional mistake, adding that the purpose of the stamp "was to express our gratitude to the Croatian EU Presidency for the assistance and support that the Republic of Croatia gives to our country."

As is often the case, it is probable that some of the stamps were sold before the issue was withdrawn, and examples may their way into the marketplace.

The webinars generally last about an hour. After they end a lightly edited video of the event is often posted to a platform such as Vimeo or YouTube, allowing it to be watched later.

Many organizations post links to their videos on their websites and allow them to be freely viewed even by nonmembers for a limited time.

The combination of intimacy and erudition afforded by these novel philatelic events has made them an instant hit.

Larry Haber, president of the Collectors Club, said that more than 270 people joined the club's webinar on June 10, at which Wade Saadi showed and discussed one of his favorite topics, United States fancy cancels of the 19th century struck on the 5¢ Franklin and 10¢ Washington stamps of 1847.

By comparison an in-person presentation at the club's Manhattan townhouse would normally attract a maximum of about 50 people.

The Collectors Club has been hosting a new webinar every other Wednesday at 6 p.m., leaving each video up for two weeks until the next webinar.

Club members can log in to view previous videos, as well as to access the extensive video archive of pre-pandemic presentations.

The virtual program is scheduled to run through the fall and seems likely to become a permanent feature of the club's offerings in the future, Haber said.

The APS, for its part, has been hosting virtual club meetings for a number of affiliated societies, including the Garfield-Perry Stamp Club and Nevada Stamp Study Society.

The Royal Philatelic Society London, which has been running its own series of webinars, has a page on its website listing a variety of stamp and postal history webinars from around the world.

Commemorative Coins of Modern India: Year wise & mint wise journey with ICCG News आधुनिक भारत के स्मरणीय सिक्के: वर्षवार, टक्साल्वार यात्रा ICCG न्यूज़ के साथ

ommemorative coins of India are usually issued to celebrate some special occasion or to mark a special event. They also have been issued as a mark of respect towards some distinguished individuals or monument. Indian commemorative coins were issued from the 1964 onwards. Such coins have a distinct design with reference to the occasion on which they were issued. Few coins of this category serve as collector's items only, although most commemorative coins are issued for regular circulation. Modern and Commemorative Indian Coins are very interesting to discuss as they cover various topics like Indian Independence Struggle, War, Peace, Wildlife, Vegetation, Great Personalities, Various Events and Organizations. The highest valued coin is INR 1000 that was issued on the occasion of 1000 years of Brihadeeswarar Temple. In 1 set, there may be 2 to 9 coins of different denominations. MINTS: Commemorative coins are made at various mints across India including the ones at (Bombay) Mumbai, Noida, (Calcutta) Kolkata & Hyderabad.

1996 – Sardar Patel Commemorative Issue

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel (October 31, 1875- December 15, 1950) was popularly known as Iron Man of India. He successfully led Kheda Satyagraha and Bardoli revolt against British government. He was elected Congress President in 1931. He played a leading role in the Indian freedom struggle and became the first Deputy Prime Minister and Home Minister of India. He is credited with achieving political integration of India.He was posthumously conferred Bharat Ratna in 1991.



This 2 rupees coin was issued in his commemoration for general circulation. The other 3 coins were issued, in the denomination of 10 rupees, 50 rupees and the 100 rupees, as uncirculated / proof specimens.

Obverse: The obverse of this coin shows the Ashokan lion, 'Satyameva Jayate' in Hindi and the value '2' in International numerals under it. In English "INDIA" and "RUPEES" appear on the right periphery and in Hindi "Bharat" and "Rupaye" appear on the left.

U.S. Mint Schedules

Release of Basketball Hall of Fame Commemorative Coins

The United States Mint updated their product schedule to include release dates with prices for several numismatic issues, like the dome-shaped commemorative coins celebrating the 60th anniversary of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

The U.S. Mint was set to introduce the commemoratives in early April but events supporting their launch were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, resulting in their delayed release. Their new on sale date is June 4.

Authorized under Public Law 15-343, Basketball coin products include 50c clad, silver dollar and \$5 gold options in collector qualities of proof and uncirculated. There is also an enhanced uncirculated Basketball half dollar that is exclusive to a kids set.



Introductory prices for all but the Basketball gold coins are established. They range from \$37 to \$69. Eventual regular prices will be \$5 higher. Prices for the gold coins will be announced on the Wednesday before their release (June 3) and based on the Mint's gold coin pricing matrix.

The Mint will also sell their first-ever colorized coins as part of their Basketball Hall of Fame Commemorative Coin Program. There will be a proof Basketball 50c with a colorized obverse and a proof Basketball silver dollar with a colorized reverse. Their release date and prices have yet to be announced.

Rolls and bags of quarters commemorating Connecticut's Weir Farm National Historic Site were also delayed because of coronavirus. Originally meant to launch April 6, the new schedule released them on May 18. The companion five-ounce Weir Farm silver uncirculated coin was also available on the 18th.

Syrian Gold Coin with Arabic Inscription Unearthed in Madurai, Tamil Nadu

ew Delhi: Syrians gold coin inscribed "There is no God, but GOD", in Arabic has been unearthed at at Elandhakkarai near Kalaiyar Koil in Sivagangai district where excavations are being carried out by the Tamil Nadu archaeology department.

According to the leading Tamil weekly magazine, 'Anantha Vikatan', the gold coin found during the excavation seems to be 6th century AH coins. In Keezhadi, the outskirts of Madurai and border of Sivagangai district, now the 6th phase of excavation in going on, this was inaugurated by the state Chief Minister



Edapadi Palanisami before lock down on February 19, 2020. During the lockdown period the excavation work was halted which has been now started again. Archeological activist Gemini Ramesh told the Tamil weekly that 6th Century Syrian Gold Coin was found under the earth at Elandhakkarai near Kalaiyar Koil, Sivagangai district of Tamil Nadu. The unearthing of the gold coin shows the advent of Islam very early in Madurai area.

The Keeladi findings have led academics to describe the site as part of the Vaigai Valley Civilization. Evidences of

civilization before 2300 years have been found here in Keezhadi few years back. That is why the excavation has been going on since 2015.

Mohamed Yusuff, Madurai resident who is lawyer by profession, told Muslim Mirror that Islam arrived in Madurai even before Malik Kafur's invasion of Madurai in the 14th century. Quoting History professor R Venkataraman, Yusuff said even before the advent of Islam, Arabs maintained trade links with South India, especially for the pearls Madurai Pandya Kingdom was famous for.

"Sufis, Muslim saints, started coming to Tamil Nadu by 900 AD. The entry of Islam to the region was peaceful as Sufis conceived God as love," he said.

According to Venkataraman, the short-lived Madurai Sultanate and Islamic influence did have their impact on the city, especially on warfare and town planning.

"Muslim rulers introduced arch construction they learnt from the Romans. It changed the style of architecture here in a significant way."

Yusuff further said that his home is situated at the river bank of Vaigai and the excavation sites his not far away from his locality. Meanwhile, the excavation work has been revived after the lockdown was lifted in the area. He hoped that many things related to Islam's early presence would be uncovered during the excavation.
