olkota: Dealers at Mudra Utsav, an exhibition of coins and other collectibles underway at Haldiram Banquet in south Kolkata's Ballygunge, recently faced a new headache — not surprisingly visitors came to sell commonplace commemorative coins and expecting astronomical prices.

This, they said, is the result of a fraud that is gaining currency through YouTube videos that promise such prices. "These videos show coins in circulation like the Rs 5 Indira Gandhi or Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board commemorative and claim they would fetch a lakh or more each.



People are getting so lured that when the tricksters seek Rs 2,000 or so as registration fee along with their Aadhaar and PAN numbers, they

promptly oblige. The money, the videos promise, would reach their bank account directly.





Preserving paper money isn't too difficult of a feat, and when done right, you will have these precious collectibles for years to come. Where you save your money is as important as what material you will use to preserve the money. Smudges on banknotes result from handling them with your bare hands. You might think that your palms are not moist, but in reality, they have water and oil, which actually transfers to the notes and lower the quality. Same applies to plastic covers and sheets for preserving collectible notes or autographs or any other valuable paper collectible. If you thought that plastic is safe and have put your

antique currency notes into just any plastic holder, it's time to wake up. Not all plastics are good for your currency. Purchase the necessary storage materials. Normal household stationery made of plastic won't do. Most plastic varieties

commonly are acid washed, which can leach out into the currency notes and damage them.

Banknotes are vulnerable to many things, even with the best banknote holders. You have to be too careful. If you want to preserve your paper



money, it's best to take it to a professional restorer. Remember, banknotes that have been treated in any way will have a lower rating. So if you want your notes to receive a high rating, be careful in how you preserve the currency.

Once they pay the fee, the buyer's phone number cannot be reached anymore. This is harming our trade," said Ravi Shankar Sharma, secretary, Numismatic Society of Calcutta, which is organising the exhibition. The dealers' association has tried tracing the numbers. "We found them registered in the names of people who have no clue that such a phone number exists in their name. It seems the Aadhaar numbers of the targets are being used to register SIM cards," he said. The fraud has become so rampant that the society has issued a notice alerting people. But that is not stopping the flow of hopefuls.

Basant Kumar Rethi, a prominent dealer, turned away "at least 30 such people" on the first day of the show. "One said he had already paid the registration fee but was unable to contact the 'buyer' now. I told him not to keep his hopes up," he said.


Worse is the harassment faced by Sharma, whose mobile number was posted in the event announcement in social media.

"My WhatsApp chatbox is flooded with messages of pictures of ordinary coins, asking how many lakhs we'd pay if they visit the fair. I am getting over 200 calls daily," Sharma said. One such call came from Nepal while he was speaking to Metro. A family of 15 from Assam had turned up at the venue in the morning with bags full of coins. "They must have thought they'd make enough from the sale to make the journey worthwhile. Imagine their distress when we told them it's a scam," Sharma said.

To prevent any disruption, the organisers had hired six bouncers. While lots of interesting collectibles, from foreign currency notes to old Indian coins to stamps made of unusual materials, were on sale, there was a special show on coins, tokens, medals and banknotes put up by individual collectors to commemorate 75 years of India's independence. she said in a statement. For much of the last 90 years, the quarter has depicted the first US president, George Washington, on one side and an eagle on the other.

In 1999, the US launched a series of quarters honoring the 50 states, with a state's design depicted on the coin's reverse. The program was expanded to include US territories and national parks. The new quarters -- which have been minted in Philadelphia and Denver -- show Washington on one side and Angelou on the other. The other figures set to appear on the coin in 2022 are: Sally Ride, the first American woman in space; Wilma Mankiller, first female principal chief of the Cherokee Nation; Nina Otero-Warren, a suffrage leader; and Anna May Wong, a Chinese-American film star.

LEGACY HONORED

Born in Missouri in 1928, Angelou was an essayist and poet who worked with civil rights leaders Martin Luther King Jr. and Malcolm X. Angelou, who delivered the poem at Bill Clinton's first presidential inauguration, died in 2014. Yellen has also signaled support for recognizing former slave and abolitionist Harriet Tubman on US currency. Former president Barack Obama launched an effort to put Tubman's face on the \$20 bill but it stalled under Donald Trump's

administration.

Putting Tubman, a black woman who escaped slavery and became a leader of the pre-Civil War abolitionist movement, on the bill would be an "honor" but designing banknotes takes time, Yellen said in September.

Many US lawmakers celebrated the release of the Angelou quarters, including congress woman Ayanna Pressley. "Black women have historically done the most for our country while receiving the least recognition," the Massachusetts Democrat tweeted. "Glad to see Maya Angelou, a shero of mine, have her legacy honored."

Nevertheless, better late than never and we are pleased we could offer them in time for increased Christmas season mail."

The three stamp issues that were set to be published during the last quarter were: celebrating Her Majesty The Queen's 95th birthday, remembering His Royal Highness Prince Philip, and commemorating Christmas 2021. Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh passed away in April at the age of 99.

With the ink now dry on the last stamps for 2021, Glasgow said her

team is already moving on with their 2022 editions.

"Development work on our 2022 stamp issues is already underway so the Postal Service will continue to release stamp issues going into the future, as we have done in the past," she added.

The full set of stamps and First Day Cover for the Prince Philip stamp issue are available for purchase at the Philatelic Bureau located in the Seven Mile Beach Post Office on West Bay Road.

U.S. Postal Service Reveals More Stamps for 2022

ashington, 11th January, 2022: The U.S. Postal Service has announced several additions to the 2022 stamp program first announced last fall. All stamp designs are preliminary and subject to change. Palace of Fine Arts

An eye-catching sight in the Marina District of San Francisco, the Palace of Fine Arts has long been a source of pride for residents and an attraction for visitors from around the world. This Priority Mail Express stamp celebrates the iconic architectural landmark.

The stamp features a digital illustration showing the rotunda and part of the colonnades of the Palace of Fine Arts, with a small lagoon in the foreground. Art director Greg Breeding designed the stamp with original art by Dan Cosgrove. This stamp will be released in San Francisco, without a first-day-of-issue ceremony, on Feb. 14.

Monument Valley

This Priority Mail stamp celebrates Monument Valley, an iconic landscape of the American West. Reminiscent of a vintage travel poster, the stamp art emphasizes the vast stone formations of Monument Valley while highlighting the vivid colors of the sky, the land and the area's distinctive plant life. The digital illustration is based on photographs of Monument Valley, including a view facing northwest at sunrise. Art director Greg Breeding designed the stamp with original art by Dan Cosgrove.

This stamp will be released in Monument Valley, UT, without a first-day-of-issue ceremony, on Feb. 14.

African Daisy

Send greetings to friends and family overseas with this beautiful stamp featuring the intricate design of a colorful African daisy, photographed from above.

Native to southern Africa and often called the African daisy, plants from the Osteospermum genus are widely available in U.S. nurseries. This round, Global stamp can be used to mail a 1-ounce letter to any country to which First-Class Mail International service is available. This Forever stamp will have a

postage value equivalent to the price of the single-piece First-Class Mail International 1-0 u n c e machineable letter in effect at the time of use.

The African Daisy stamp is being issued in self-adhesive panes of 10. Greg Breeding designed the stamp with existing photography

by Cindy Dyer. William Gicker was the art director.

This stamp will be released in Kansas City, MO, without a first-day-of-issue ceremony, on March 14.

Shel Silverstein

The extraordinarily versatile Shel Silverstein (1930–1999) was one of the 20th century's most imaginative authors and illustrators. His picture book "The Giving Tree" and his quirky poetry collections are beloved by children everywhere. The stamp art features a version of the illustration of a boy catching an apple that appears on the cover of "The Giving Tree." Published in 1964, the best-selling tale of selflessness is considered a children's literature classic. Art director Derry Noyes designed the stamp. Flags on Barns

Painted flags can be found on barns in almost every region of the United States. Four colorful pencil and water color illustrations of flags on barns grace the latest issuance of stamps available for bulk-mail users. The barns are set in landscapes inspired by the seasons and different regions of the United States. The stamps will be sold in self-adhesive coils of 3,000 and 10,000. Stephanie Bower designed and illustrated the stamps. Antonio Alcalá was the art director.







Floral Geometry

The two similarly designed Floral Geometry stamps, denominated at \$2 and \$5, lend an elegant and contemporary appearance to packages, large envelopes and other mailings. The stamp art features a series of overlapping geometric shapes that mimic the symmetry of floral patterns found in nature.

The watercolor backgrounds and the glimmer of the foil-stamped designs and typography create a sophisticated look. The \$2 stamp will be issued in panes of 10. The \$5 stamp will be issued in panes of four. The stamps were designed and created by the firm Spaeth Hill. Antonio Alcalá was the art director.

Mariachi Filled with passion, rhythm and stories of life, love and loss, mariachi music is an integral element of Mexican American culture that has become deeply rooted in the United States and has fans around the world. Each of the five vibrant stamps in this pane of 20 features a musician dressed in a traje de charro, the traditional outfit of mariachi performers, playing one of five iconic mariachi instruments: guitar, guitarrón, vihuela, violin and trumpet. Rafael López designed the stamps and created the art. Derry Noyes was the art director.

issued. Few coins of this category serve as collector's items only, although most commemorative coins are issued for regular circulation. Modern and Commemorative Indian Coins are very interesting to discuss as they cover various topics like Indian Independence Struggle, War, Peace, Wildlife, Vegetation, Great Personalities, Various Events and Organizations. The highest valued coin

is INR 1000 that was issued on the occasion of 1000 years of Brihadeeswarar Temple. In 1 set, there may be 2 to 9 coins of different denominations.

MINTS: Commemorative coins are made at various mints across India including the ones at (Bombay) Mumbai, Noida, (Calcutta) Kolkata & Hyderabad.

1995 –50TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE F.A.O COMMEMORATION ISSUE

he Food and Agriculture Organization (F.A.O.) is a specialized Agency of United Nations Organization (U.N.O.). It was founded on 16th October, 1945 at Quebec (Canada). The objectives of F.A.O. are to improve agricultural productivity and to better the condition of rural poor, thus raising the level of nutrition and standard of living the world over. India is also one of the founding members of the F.A.O.

Since 1981, every year, the 16th October—the foundation day of the F.A.O. is celebrated by member nations throughout the world, as World Food Day. In observance of the

50th Anniversary of the F.A.O., India brought out this 5 rupees coin for general circulation on 16th October, 1995.

Obverse: The obverse of this coin shows the Ashokan lion, 'Satyameva Jayate' in Hindi and the value '5' in International numerals under it. In English "INDIA" and "RUPEES" appear on the right periphery and in Hindi "Bharat" and "Rupaye" appear on the left.

Reverse: The reverse of this coin shows a hand holding a bundle of wheat and barley, with the F.A.O. crest stamped on the back of the hand. The inscription that appears around the periphery is - 'Khadya

> Ebam Krushi Samgathhan' in Hindi in the top half and 'FOOD AND AGRICULTURE ORGANIZATION' in English in the bottom half. The

The department had decided to allow viewers access to the digital exhibition for one month. Tamil Nadu Postal Circle hosted a virtual philately exhibition titled TN Digipex 2022. The exhibition that was earlier going to end on January 10 has the theme -India's rich cultural heritage. This virtual exhibition is supported by South India Philatelists' Association (SIPA), Chennai. B Mahesh Parekh, secretary of SIPA, tells DT Next, "Our aim is to help people know what stamp collecting is all about and its importance in today's world.
